### General Medical Procedures

# General Notification of Prehospital Personnel Regarding Potential Exposures to Communicable Diseases

This policy serves as a guide for preventing prehospital exposure to infectious disease as well as action to be taken if an exposure occurs. This includes bloodborne exposure.

### Exposure:

- 1. Blood and/or body fluids splashed into eyes, nose and/or mouth.
- 2. Blood and/or body fluids coming in direct contact with open cuts or other breaks in the skin.
- 3. Puncture wounds or cuts to the skin with contaminated needles or other sharp instruments, including human bites.
- 4. Intimate contact with oral secretions such as would occur with mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.
- 5. Close contact with actively coughing patient with suspected active T.B.

### Procedure:

- A. All students and public safety personnel who provide patient care will undergo training in Universal Precautions.
- B. Students and personnel will stay informed about current practices and knowledge related to infectious diseases. Universal Precautions/BSI/PPE shall be done for every patient if contact with their blood or body fluid is possible, regardless of whether a diagnosis is known or not. This includes, but not limited to, starting IVs, airway management or intubation, caring for a trauma patient, or assisting with an OB/BYN emergency.
- C. All SMS students, agencies, departments, or services providing prehospital care will adhere to OSHA regulations as identified in OSHA Final Bloodborne Pathogen Standard (29 CFR 1910.1030).
- D. Personnel who feel an exposure has occurred should complete the Michigan Department of Community Health, First Responder Provider Request Form For HIV/Hepatitis B Testing of Emergency Patient. A copy of the completed form should be given to the charge nurse at the hospital that received the patient involved in the exposure. In cases of SMS student exposure, a copy of the form should be provided to the Program Director.
- E. Participating hospitals shall respond to the First Responder Provider Request form:
  - 1. If hospital determines that an exposure did occur, they shall respond to the First Responder Provider Request form in one of the following ways:



- a. If no diagnostic tests for the presence of infectious diseases were performed during the patient's hospital stay, then the hospital will inform the individual completing the First Responder Provider Request form that the information is unknown due to lack of diagnostic testing.
- b. If diagnostic testing for infectious disease is performed, the results, whether positive or negative, will be reported to the individual completing the First Responder Provider Request form. In the case of SMS student, the results will be shared with the Program Director.
- 2. If the hospital responsible determines that no exposure occurred, this must be documented on the First Responder Provider Request Form.
- F. Patient confidentiality must be maintained. Failure to do so is a violation of the law.
- G. If the patient's name is unknown at time of admission to the hospital, the usual hospital policy for the identification of the patient will be used and test results will be reported in a manner consistent with that policy. The prehospital personnel may follow-up with the hospital and upon learning the patient's identity, file a second First Responder Provider Request form.

- "First Responder Provider" is defined as a police officer, fire fighter, or an individual licensed under MCL.333.20950 or 333.20952 as one of the
  following: medical first responder, emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician specialist, paramedic, or an emergency medical
  services instructor or coordinator. A lay citizen, or Good Samaritan, if they assist an emergency patient, may also be included as a pre-hospital provider
  (for purposes of this law).
- "Emergency source patient" means an individual who is transported to an organized emergency department located in and operated by a licensed
  hospital or a facility other than a hospital that is routinely available for the general care of medical patients.
